

## **Code of Conduct for Youth Cricketers**

Rockhampton Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members.

Rockhampton Cricket Club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents/carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with Dave Long (Youth Manager), Richard Crabtree (Child Welfare Officer) or Neil Higginson (Head Coach).

As a member of Rockhampton Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion. There must be no bullying, teasing, intimidation or abuse directed towards members of this or any other cricket club.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – white cricket shirts or training tops, cricket whites or tracksuit trousers and cricket boots or training shoes– for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members must not leave training sessions without the permission of the coach/manager and should not leave after matches until they have completed any tasks the manager may have asked them to do.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
